1. The Wellington Regional Native Plant Guide (John Holmes and others)

As Councillors will be aware, the launch of the Plant Guide is to be held on October 21, with Jack Hobbs (media personality and Curator/Manager of the Auckland Regional Botanic Garden) as guest speaker.

The Guide has been a significant undertaking for the Regional Policy Statement implementation team and we are proud of the finished product. Many people have worked on the Guide but I would like to put on record my thanks to John Holmes, Marianne Miller, and Lisa Neville for their contributions in bringing the Guide to a successful conclusion.
