# Manager's Report, Resource Policy Wayne Hastie, Manager

# November 1999

### 1. **Regional Plans**

A summary of the status of the various Environment Court references on regional plans is attached. Changes from the last meeting are shown in bold.

#### (1) **Regional Coastal Plan (Wayne Hastie)**

Two of the three outstanding appeals have been resolved by consent order. The remaining appeal has been set down for a hearing on or about the  $13^{th}$  December, and we hope that it can be determined at that time.

#### (2) **Regional Plan for Discharges to Land (Kirsten Forsyth)**

The Council gave its final approval to this Plan at its meeting on 4 November 1999. Staff are making final preparations for the printing and notification of the Plan. There has been a minor hold-up in the printing due to the unavailability of recycled paper. However, the printing should be complete by early December, allowing notification before Christmas.

#### (3) Regional Air Quality Management Plan (Nicki Kinghorn)

Stack testing has been completed and we are awaiting the results to determine the appropriate limits for the spray painting rule in the Plan. We remain hopeful that the information will be sufficient to allay the concerns of the Moir Street residents, and hence resolve the last appeal on the Plan. The appeal has been set down for a call-over at the Environment Court on 13 December, giving added impetus to resolve the matter before then.

#### (4) Regional Freshwater Plan (Kirsten Forsyth, Murray McLea)

As per the Regional Plan for Discharges to Land.

#### (5) Regional Soil Plan (Nicki Kinghorn)

Some progress has been made. Firstly, the parties to the Transit New Zealand appeal have reached agreement and placed a draft consent order before the Environment Court. Secondly, a jurisdictional hearing was held on the Federated Farmers (Wairarapa) appeal, during which one of the parties withdrew. We await the Court's decision. Thirdly, we have filed an application with the High Court to strike out Mr Riddifords appeal on the decision of the Environment Court to decline his application for a waiver for late service of his appeal on the Plan.

## 2. **Regional Plan Implementation**

#### (1) Community and School Beach and Stream Management (Jo Fagan)

A group of Naenae School children were taken on an afternoon fieldtrip to learn about riparian plant species. In addition, a resource workshop was held at the school to see how the school's desire to be involved in management of the Waiwhetu Stream could be integrated into the school curriculum and how resources and activities could be adapted and/or designed to enable this to occur.

Staff created a display for the *Sustainable Wellington Green Day* that included material on community involvement in clean-up events.

#### (2) **On-site Sewage Treatment (Kirsten Forsyth)**

The first draft of a report "Guide to On-Site Sewage Treatment and Disposal" has been completed and released for internal peer review. The report provides information for territorial authorities. Four pamphlets for homeowners have also been drafted, and consultation is scheduled with territorial authority staff.

#### (3) Review of Air Discharge Problems (Nicki Kinghorn)

We are reviewing the information we have about air discharges in the Region to identify the main contributors of pollutants, and the areas that we should focus on when promoting non-regulatory methods to mitigate the effects of air discharges. Examination of the consents database, pollution response database, emissions inventory, and air quality monitoring reports has been completed.

#### (4) **Promotion of Code of Practise for the Management of Agrichemicals** (Nicki Kinghorn)

Work has commenced on this project and we are checking whether Regional Council and territorial authority staff are complying with the Code of Practise. A list of spraying contractors and relevant organisations is being compiled with a view to working with them to determine the best means of encouraging farmers to comply with the Code.

## 3. Iwi matters (Tracey Whare)

We are currently consulting with Iwi and hapu on the paper that was discussed at the Councillor workshop on 1 November, and will be reporting back to Ara Tahi on 1 December. Hopefully a collective view can be agreed at the Ara Tahi meeting, and the proposals can then be progressively implemented.

## 4. Planwell (Nigel Clarke)

Planwell has been reformatted this year into three parts to provide documents targeted at specific audiences – community groups, businesses and schools. The additional complexities arising from producing three separate publications meant that production fell slightly behind time, but staff are happy with the result. The publications are pilots and we are seeking feedback on their content and format.

### 5. Staff

Bernie Manaena is currently on secondment to the Department for a ten-week period. Bernie comes to us from Ngati Kahungunu, and is working on coastal issues.

Jan Hania is due to start as the Hazard Analyst on 1 December, and Paul Denton is transferring to the Department from Resource Investigations on 6 December.
