OPERATIONAL PROGRESS

Appendix 2 references these sites, (e.g. WCC:7 refers to site 7 within Wellington City Council boundaries.

The abbreviation RTC means 'residual trap-catch' and refers to a monitoring result based on the number of possums caught over a given number of trap nights expressed as a percentage. For example, six possum caught over 150 trap nights results in a RTC of 4%. All of the Biosecurity Department's possum operations, including those carried out by external contract, aim for a RTC of 5% or less.
