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Progress Report - Maori Policy Advisors

1. Purpose

To provide Ara Tahi with an update for the months of August, September and October 2003.

2. Training Initiatives

2.1 Staff Training

Fourteen staff members have recently enrolled on the next ten-week introductory Te Reo course. The course involves two weeks of pronunciation training and eight weeks of basic Te Reo. The course will run from 8 October to 10 December. We will continue to offer the introductory Te Reo course to staff. It is important for all staff to have the opportunity to attend this training. Following feedback from Ara Tahi we are also exploring options for Tikanga training as well. This may involve covering the protocols of Powhiri.

2.2 Iwi Technical Workshops

The Iwi Technical Workshop of 15 October discussed the administrative and non-notified consents contract reviews. The outcomes of the workshop are the subject of a separate report to Ara Tahi.

3. Iwi Projects

3.1 Wellington Tenths Trust

3.1.1 Inventory of Mäori Heritage sites and values

A contract for the last year of this three-year project has been negotiated and signed. Wellington Tenths Trust will present an oral report and updated presentation of the GIS project to Ara Tahi.

3.2 Ngati Kahungunu

3.2.1 Okautete Bush

Work has commenced on spraying at the reserve. Ryshell Griggs will be learning towards certification of the Growsafe Certificate on behalf of the hapu. She has been kitted out with safety equipment and will attend training with the Conservation Corps.

3.3 Rangitaane O Wairarapa

3.3.1 Haamua Project II

Dane Rimene and Joseph Potangaroa have been busy with site visits these past weeks adding more sites to their database. Joseph has been working on the Haamua history report, which has been reviewed by kaumätua. Editing of the document will begin shortly.
