Madeira vine is a menace!

We need your help to get rid of this invasive plant completely from the Wellington region.



Madeira vine (also

known as mignonette vine) has been found in your neighbourhood. If you suspect it may be on your property, or know of other sites, contact us and we will control it free of charge.

Impact

Madeira vine can damage our environment. If left uncontrolled it will smother and replace other plant species.

Madeira vine is currently limited throughout the Wellington region, so with your help we have an opportunity to eliminate it completely by acting now, before it spreads further.

Description

Madeira vine is a climbing vine that grows up to 20 metres high.

The leaves of mignonette vine are alternate, bright green, heart-shaped and fleshy and grow from fleshly reddish-brown stems.

Small greenish white flowers appear between January and April. The flowers hang on racemes that reach 18cm long.

Reproduction is via tubers that grow out of the aerial stems as well as underground. These tubers can remain viable in the soil for many years before germinating.
