4. WAIWHETU STREAM FLOOPLAIN MANAGEMENT STUDY (N/3/21/1/RM50-15-11)

Report No. WSA2005/2/1 by the Manager, Flood Protection and Divisional Manager, Utility Services – circulated pages WSAC 1-1 to 1-50 or Bound Volume.

The Manager Flood Protection elaborated on the report and highlighted the purpose of the study and the timeline for the project. He said that a consultation programme will be presented to the next meeting.

Mr B Paul, Consultant DamWatch Services Limited made a presentation on the Waiwhetu Stream Floodplain Management Study Technical Implementation report.

The Hydraulic Modeller made a presentation and showed an animated model of the floodplain.

In response to a question from the Members, the Consultant explained the management responsibilities for the Waiwhetu Stream and Awamutu Stream floodplains. He further advised that the long-term management of any flood protection assets on the Waiwhetu Stream would be managed under both councils' asset management plans.

The Biosecurity Coordinator made a presentation on the Waiwhetu Stream Rehabilitation Project and the outcomes.

Cr Evans said there was a need for both councils to consider both the work programmes of the Hutt River Advisory Committee and Waiwhetu Stream Advisory Committee when considering priorities for their long term council community plans.

Mayor Ogden expressed concern with the project timeline and the need to do something now to mitigate future flood events. He highlighted that the Hutt Valley is the most densely populated floodplain in New Zealand.
