Impact

Sweet pea shrub can damage our environment. If left uncontrolled it will smother and replace other plant species.

Sweet pea shrub is currently limited throughout the Wellington region, so with your help we have an opportunity to eliminate it completely by acting now, before it spreads further.

Description

Sweet pea shrub is an attractive bush from South Africa that can grow to 2m high. Seedlings generally occur close to parent plants.

The alternate light green leaves are broadly oval and grow to 2.5cm with rounded or blunt tips. The pea-like flowers grow in clusters at the end of each branch. The petals are pinkypurple, and the middle petal (keel) is white with a purple blush ending in a tuft of white hairs. The outside of the flower is streaked with green. Cultivated varieties have slightly larger, less open flowers and the keel of the flower is predominantly purple.
