In considering the proposed amendments we have assumed there is some potential for the specific wording and overall approach to be applied to rural areas.</p> <p>We acknowledge that only long-term visions for urban catchments have been included in this variation due to the status of the WIP statements and upcoming regulatory processes in the FMU's. Going forward any long-term visions developed for rural whitua should be done in a way that clarifies if the council intends to include them in an RPS.</p>	Retain as notified.
